



New Phases of Woodstock Greenprints Trails

Towne to Creek / Noonday Creek Trail

The Town to Creek Trail opened in May 2014 to great celebration at Trailfest 2014. The trail has become a hit with in-town trail enthusiasts. The 1.3 mile segment runs from downtown at Market Street and continues along Noonday Creek among a heavily wooded natural setting. New enhancements to this popular trail began immediately and include the current construction of a new pedestrian bridge across Noonday Creek to connect the trail to Woofstock Dog Park.

Rubes Creek Trail

The design of the Trail was finalized and funding is being provided through a GDOT Transportation Enhancement Grant. Construction has begun on this trail in October 2014. The Rubes Creek Trail will be located off Arnold Mill Road near Fire Station 14 and will head south for approximately 3/4 of a mile. It will be a ten foot multi-use trail that will eventually be part of the Downtown Loop.

Greenprints Trail Master Plan

Through the vision of the Mayor Henriques and the City Council, a park master plan was commissioned by the City of Woodstock in 2008 through a citizen-based planning process. The focus on this plan was to use the miles of riparian and natural corridors in our area to lay out a 60+ mile network of multi-use trails connecting present and future greenspaces and providing a different mode of travel within our city. The mission of Greenprints Alliance is to advocate for a sustainable greenspace and trail network which enhances the City of Woodstock's community, natural and economic resources for all generations by promoting the benefits of a green infrastructure system to the general public.
