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## **Blasting Permit Checklist**

- A Blasting Permit must be obtained from the City of Woodstock's Building Department prior to any blast taking place.
- All blasting sites must meet the requirements of [Georgia 120-3-10](#) along with any amendments.
- The site is required to be inspected by a Fire Inspector from the Fire Marshal's Office prior to blasting.
- Blasting Permit Applications must be submitted to the Permit Office before inspections can be scheduled.
- The following must be submitted along with the Blast Permit Application:
  1. Federal license (Level III Competency Card)
  2. State Fire Marshal Permit
  3. Certificate of Insurance
  4. Location map and directions
  5. Fee of \$200.00
  6. Hold Harmless letter to the City of Woodstock
  7. Confirmation of notifications to property owners
- Owner / occupants of occupied structures within 750' of the blast must be notified of the blasting permit date range in writing, 48 hours prior to the blast.
- The blasting contractor must notify the City of Woodstock Building Department a minimum of 24 hours prior to blasting. Notification shall be made online by use of their [accessmygov.com](http://accessmygov.com) account. The City of Woodstock may require additional information.
- The Blasting Permit is valid for 30 days from the application approval date.
- A re-inspection fee of \$25.00 will be assessed in the event an inspector arrives on site and the blast has been postponed or cancelled, and the contractor did not notify the City of Woodstock of this change. Any re-inspection fees assessed to this permit must be paid to the Permitting Office prior to scheduling the next blast.
